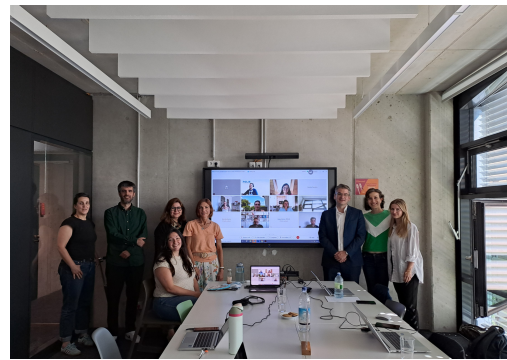

## Executive Board meeting: progress and next steps in Munich

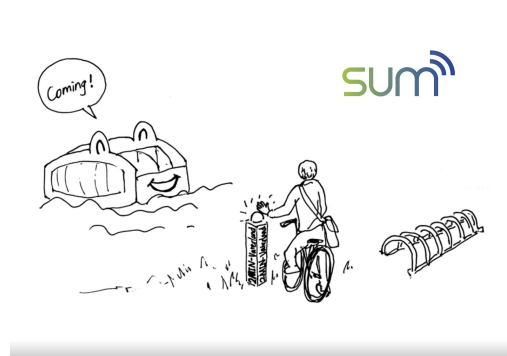
The SUM project met in Munich and online to bring together representatives from all work packages and assess progress, as well as coordinate the next phases of the project.
